

What should participants expect?

Visits are scheduled at specific times during a study. Typically, a thorough evaluation may include:

- Detailed medical history
- Physical examination
- Neurological examination
- Mental status exam
- Laboratory tests
- CT, MRI and/or PET scans

Participants must have a consistent study partner for all visits.

- Participants will receive frequent check-ups with our staff to monitor their health.
- All study-related medications and procedures are of no cost to participants.
