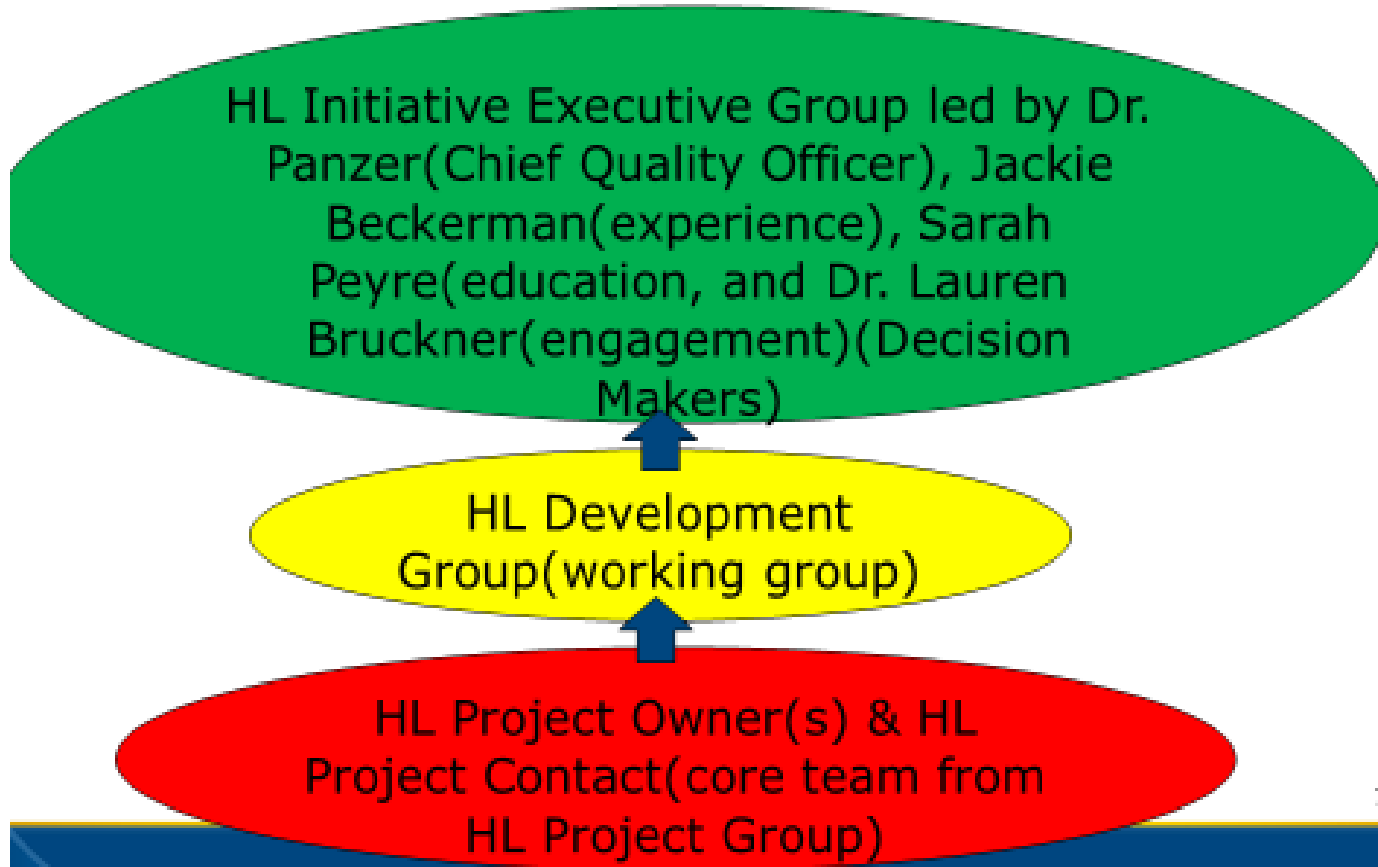
10 Attributes

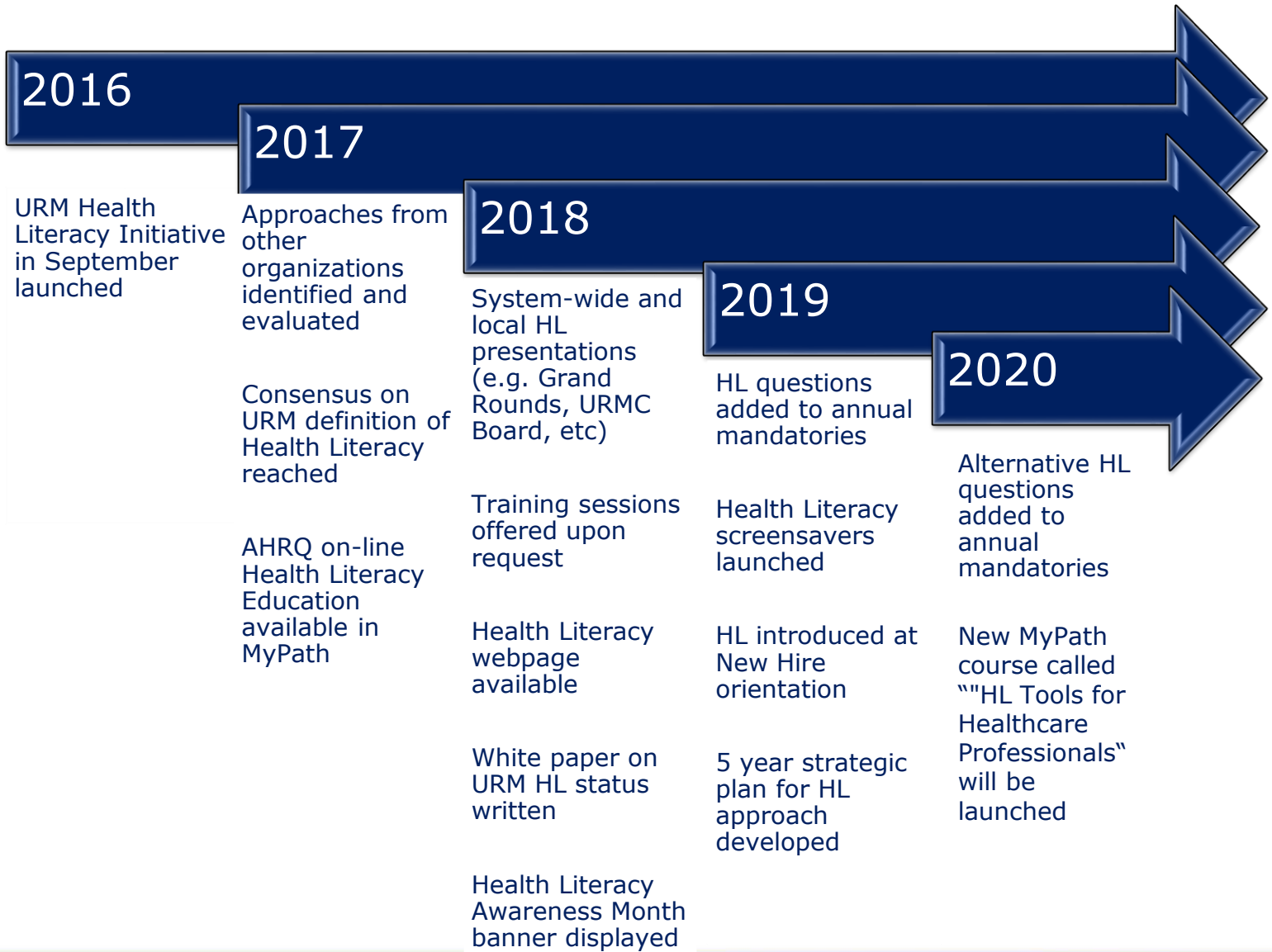

Health literacy is the degree to which individuals can obtain, process, understand, and communicate about health-related information needed to make informed health decisions.

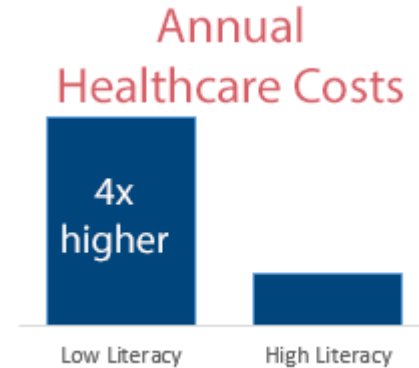

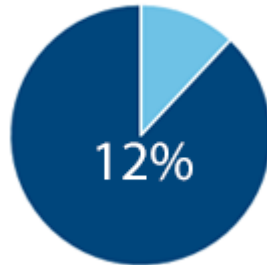

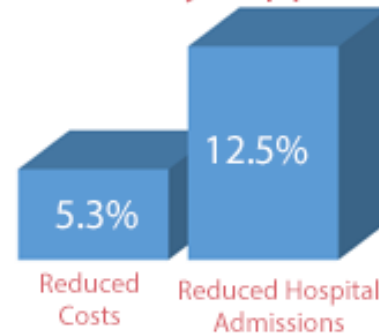

"Can you show me how you would use your inhaler at home?"

"I want to make sure I explained things clearly. Can you explain to me..."

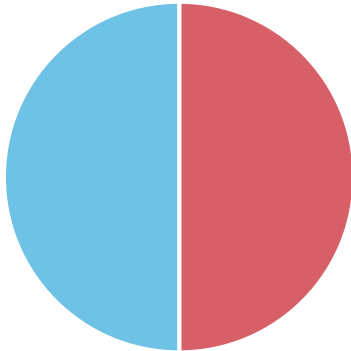

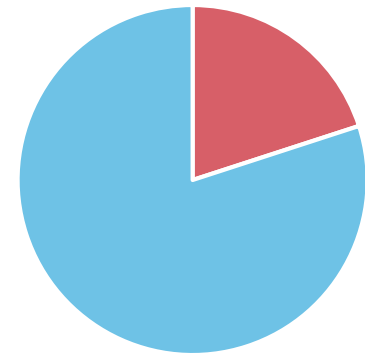

Unity Point Health Areas of Health Literacy Improvement

A good rule of thumb is to start where you can begin to build a pattern of early success.

Where do we start?.....

- Engaging leadership
- Preparing the workforce
- The care environment
- Involving populations served
- Verbal communication
- Reader-friendly materials

The Unity Point Health Process

1. Form a Team

2. Start with a Chapter

Why? **Why do you need to address health literacy issues in this area?**

Why is it important?

What? **What would success in this area look like?**

What are the target outcomes?

How? **What tools, resources, and actions will you use to reach the target outcomes?**

3. Make Change Last-**Small Test of Change(PDSA)**
