

Commencement '87:

Kobren and Kudos Highlight the Day



EDC's director William D. McHugh (left) congratulates commencement speaker Abraham Kobren, who said, "As graduates of this prestigious training program, you've had the benefit of some of the finest training in the country, perhaps, indeed, the world. Special skills, advanced education, and the extended training you've received are acknowledged not only by the profession, but certainly by the public as well. You are, in truth and in fact, the role models of tomorrow."

Twenty-nine dentists from this country and around the world received certificates marking completion of one- and two-year postdoctoral training in general dentistry, orthodontics, pediatric dentistry, periodontics, and prosthodontics in a ceremony at the Center's Farash Auditorium on Friday, June 12.

Abraham Kobren, D.D.S., immediate past president of the American Dental Association, delivered the commencement address entitled "*Dentistry: The Nation's Service.*"

Dr. Kobren graduated cum laude from Georgetown Dental School in Washington, D.C. and came to Rochester for a year's internship at the Center, then known as the Eastman Dental Dispensary and located at 800 Main Street East. He was recently appointed assistant dean for admissions, financial aid, and housing, at New York University College of Dentistry. He is also clinical professor of behavioral sciences and community health hospital dentistry at the University and a private practitioner in White Plains, N.Y.

"We did restorations, and that meant a treatment, restoration, or extraction, for five cents; and tonsillectomies for 50 cents, and that included an overnight stay at the dispensary. Dental interns administered the anesthesia and medical interns performed the tonsillectomies," Dr. Kobren recalled for the audience of graduates, families, friends, and EDC faculty and staff.

Two new awards were presented at commencement. J. Edward Gilda, assistant chairman of the Department of Orthodontics, received the EDC Part-Time Clinical Award for Excellence in Teaching. The award plaque cites Dr. Gilda's "excellence in teaching, high academic standards, continuing search for knowledge, loyalty to the institution, and...his great and beneficial impact on students."

Mikael Kautsky, research fellow in the Department of Oral Biology, was named the first Basil G. Bibby Research Fellow. The fellowship honors Dr. Bibby, who served as the Center's second director from 1947 to 1970, and is now senior scientist in the Department of Oral Biology.

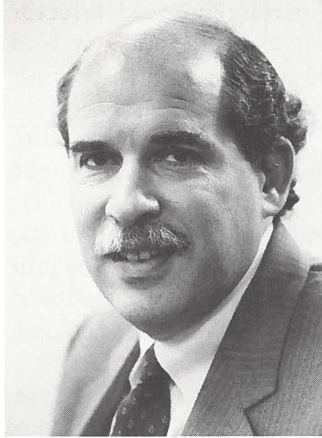

NIDR's Loe Presents Findings to Cariology Conferees

"The news is encouraging," said Dr. Harald Loe. "Americans are keeping their own teeth longer." Dr. Loe reviewed the results of the comprehensive National Survey of Adult Dental Health. During the year-long study, 21,000 adults between the ages of 18 and 103 received oral examinations from NIDR-trained dentists.

Harald Loe, director of the National Institute of Dental Research of the National Institutes of Health (NIDR/NIH), was in Rochester to speak on the implications of the National Survey of Adult Dental Health at a two-day symposium attended by approximately 100 dental scientists at the Rochester Cariology Center.

The survey documents the fact that toothlessness has been almost eliminated in middle-aged adults. The majority of adults, however, show signs of periodontal disease, with increasing prevalence and worsening of symptoms with age.

The Cariology Center, is a multidisciplinary effort jointly sponsored by the University of Rochester and the Eastman Dental Center. Affiliated with it are the University's departments of Dental Research, Microbiology, Biochemistry, and Clinical Dentistry; and EDC's departments of Community Dentistry, Pediatric Dentistry, and General Dentistry. The Cariology Center, one of three in the United States (the others are at the Forsyth Dental Center in Boston, and at the University of Iowa), receives funding from NIDR/NIH.

Director of the Cariology Center is William H. Bowen, Welcher Professor of Dental Research at the University of Rochester School of Medicine and Dentistry. John D.B. Featherstone, chairman of the Dental Center's Department of Oral Biology, serves as deputy director.

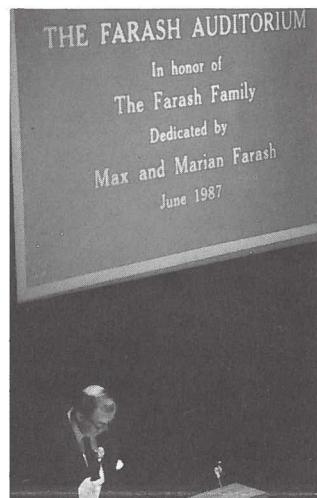

In Memoriam: Sue Ann Leone Adair

Sue Ann Leone Adair, the wife of Steven M. Adair, chairman of the Department of Pediatrics, died of cancer on June 13, 1987.

She was barely out of school when she joined the Center in November 1966, as secretary to Joanne Subtelny. Dr. Subtelny, a speech pathologist, said, "We worked very closely together on a research grant until July 1971, when I went to the National Technical Institute for the Deaf (NTID) at the Rochester Institute of Technology. A large measure of our success on the grant was directly attributed to Sue Ann; she was so beautifully organized. She was a remarkably wonderful young person when she first came to the Center and she matured into a beautiful woman. She had enormous sensitivity and great feeling for people, so

appropriate for the handicapped children and their parents we saw. My husband, Dan (J. Daniel Subtelny, chairman of the Department of Orthodontics), was principal investigator on the grant. She became his secretary after I left for NTID."

She worked with Dan Subtelny for 13 years. "She was always thinking of other people, always trying to do things for other people, always considerate," said Dr. Subtelny.

Sue Ann and Steve were married in 1978. An active member of Our Lady of Lourdes Church, Sue Ann's intense religious faith sustained her through her illness. She is also survived by daughters Erin Jo, 6, and Emily Jane, 2½; and by her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Samuel Leone.
