

## Health Humanities & Bioethics Postdoctoral Scholar Position

Position: Postdoctoral Scholar

### Position Description

The University of Rochester (UR) School of Medicine and Dentistry Department of Health Humanities and Bioethics (HHBe) is recruiting for a two-year post-doctoral scholar to engage in transplant ethics under the supervision of Dr. Margie Shaw (Director, Clinical Ethics Program) and to conduct scholarly research under the supervision of Dr. Lainie Ross (Chair, department of HHBe).

The post-doc will attend a variety of UR Medical Center Transplant Institute activities including, but not limited to, living donor selection committee, waitlist selection committee, and quality improvement meetings. They will also attend the Clinical Ethics Consultation weekly conference and scholarship meetings in the Department of Health Humanities and Bioethics. They will meet with Dr. Shaw on a regular basis.

The post-doc will also collaborate with HHBe and Transplant Institute faculty to conduct a self-directed research program on transplantation ethics, which will result in high quality publications in peer reviewed academic journals. This research program may involve philosophical, quantitative, or qualitative methods as determined by the post-docs skills and interests. They will meet with Dr. Ross on a regular basis to ensure scholarly productivity.

Application review will begin in November 2024.

### Qualifications

Applicants should have an MD, JD, or PhD. Prior scholarship in any area of solid organ transplantation is preferred but not required. Strong interpersonal skills are also required. Prior clinical ethics consultation and ASBH HEC-C preferred but not required.
