Positions Available

Time Commitment Level

- **Clinical Technician** – Work up patients prior to the doctor arriving in the room. Captures patient's chief complaint, confirms medication & family history & performs basic tests. Starting pay \$19.14/hour. Can pursue COA certification after 6 months of experience; pay increases to \$24/hour.
- **Diagnostic Technician** – Operates state-of-the-art diagnostic devices. Non-Invasive technologies to obtain images & measurements of the eye. Starting pay \$19.14/hour. Can pursue COA certification after 6 months of experience; pay increases to \$24/hour.
- **Scribe** – Follow the doctor from exam room to exam room, documenting in the Medical Record. Retrieve items as needed and assist with clinic flow. Pay is \$17.50/hour
- **Population Health Volunteer** – Travel the community, providing eye screenings and education to urban/rural adults and children. Training & commitment time is low. Volunteer.

Time As Reported (TAR) Employee

- Paid an hourly rate for hours worked
- Limited to 17.5 hours per week. Can increase hours during short school breaks. For summers or extended breaks, a switch to part-time or full-time is seamless.
- No benefits earned with TAR status
- Can work intermittently without penalty & take extended breaks from working (sports)

Creating the Win-Win

Position	Training Commitment	Working Hours Commitment
Clinical Technician	High (Typically a 40hr Bootcamp)	Minimum 8 hrs/week; either 1 full day or 2 half-days
Diagnostic Technician	High (4 hour blocks)	Minimum 12 hrs/week
Scribe	Mid (4 hour blocks)	Minimum 8 hrs/week; either 1 full day or 2 half-days
Population Health Volunteer	Low (A few videos & direction before an event starts)	No Minimum

We value consistent hours. If "Monday" is your commitment, then it needs to be your commitment for the semester.

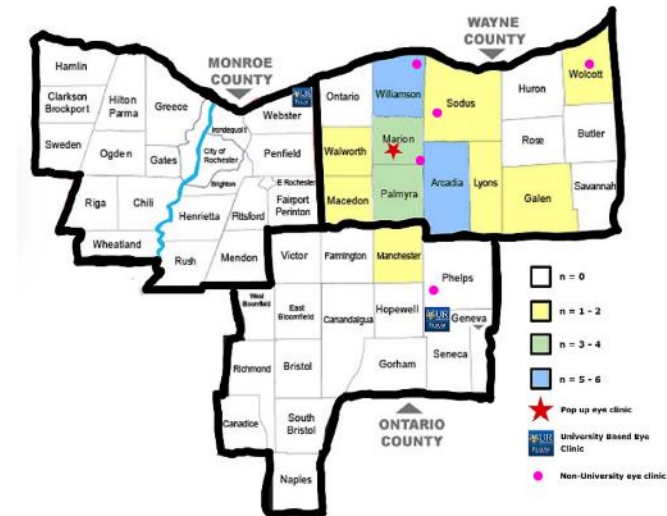
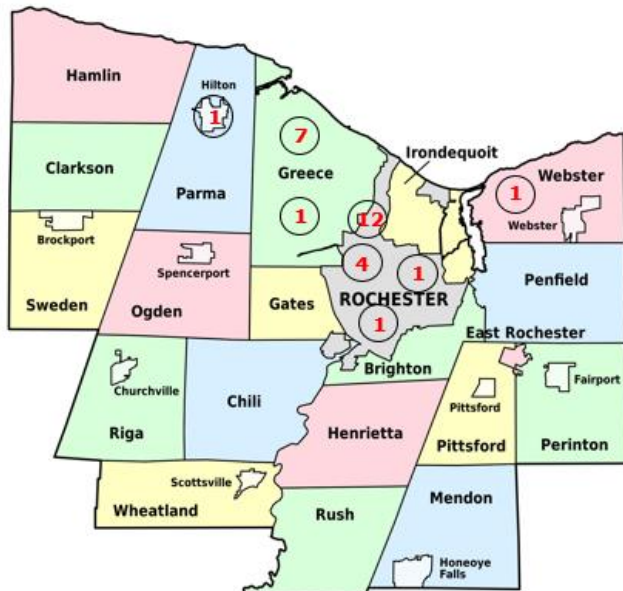
