



FLPHA MOU Operational Plan Attachment 5.1: Credentialing Protocol

Credentialing

All staff and volunteers should be credentialed by their respective Sending Counties prior to being deployed.

- Staff and volunteers should be clear of any criminal, arrest, incarceration, and sex offender records.
- Staff and volunteers should be legal citizens and/or legally authorized to work in the United States.

Credentialing specific to medical staff and volunteers:

- All licenses and/or certifications held by staff and volunteers should be current and allow them to practice within New York State.
- All staff and volunteers who are licensed professionals will have their licenses and/or certifications verified with the appropriate medical board or governing entity.

Uniforms

The Receiving County will provide uniforms and/or instructions for attire as appropriate to the event. Unless otherwise specified, county, medical, and law enforcement staff should wear their work uniforms.

Identification

All staff and volunteers will need to present photo identification while being processed by the Receiving County. Acceptable forms of photo identification include:

- Photo identification issued by their respective Sending County.
- Government issued photo identification.
- Photo identification issued by the NYSDOH, a hospital, long-term care facility, law enforcement agency, etc.
