

James A. Jancewicz Supervisory Special Agent Federal Bureau of Investigation

In 1991, Special Agent James A. Jancewicz began his law enforcement career with the United States Customs Service and was assigned to the San Francisco Field Division. While in this capacity, Special Agent Jancewicz investigated high-level Mexican and Colombian drug trafficking organizations.

In 1997, Special Agent Jancewicz was appointed to the FBI and assigned to the Buffalo Field Division. Special Agent Jancewicz investigated violent crime, street gangs, organized crime and public corruption matters. In 2007, Special Agent Jancewicz was promoted to a Supervisory Special Agent (SSA) with oversight of the FBI Safe Streets Task Force. This multi-agency task force is comprised of local, state and federal law enforcement officers with the mission to combat violent crime and street gangs in Western New York.

SSA Jancewicz also has program oversight of the FBI/Buffalo Division critical incident response elements which include the SWAT Team, Crisis Negotiation Team and the Tactical Operations Center. SSA Jancewicz is the recipient of the Commissioner of Customs Unit Citation, FBI Director's Award for Outstanding Criminal Investigation and the Erie County Law Enforcement Foundation Award.
