



THE INSTITUTE FOR HUMAN HEALTH AND THE ENVIRONMENT EXPLORATION GRANT APPLICATION IS NOW OPEN!

The UR Institute for Human Health and the Environment (IHHE) Exploration Grant is a <u>scholarship</u> to provide funds for the promotion of transdisciplinary research experiences for UR undergraduate students who wish to conduct research related to the following areas:

- The impact of environmental exposures on human health and potential underlying mechanisms by which environmental factors affect health;
- Social, economic, and cultural contributors to the creation and/or resolution of environmental health problems.

Students from Arts, Humanities, or STEM backgrounds are all encouraged to apply.

Successful students will be selected to receive <u>a grant of \$7,500</u>. This aid is to be disbursed during the summer months to cover the cost of their housing, food, transportation, or other academic costs while conducting summer research. Unused funds can be carried forward, with approval of the program director.

Research opportunity mentors must be identified in the application to be eligible for this grant. Applicants are expected to complete 300 hours of research over the course of the summer between May – August.

Eligibility:

Applicants must be <u>University of Rochester undergraduate students</u> and have a <u>cumulative GPA of 3.0 or</u> <u>greater</u>.

Friday, March 15th, 2024 at 11:59 p.m.

Dr. Sörensen is an internationally known researcher and educator in the field of Human Development and Aging.


