 Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) State Homeland Security Program (SHSP) (100% reduction, funding eliminated in 2012-2015, reinstated in 2016 and 2017, we have requested \$2M this year)
- State Appropriation (100%, funding eliminated in 2014)




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Response Accomplishments

Coordinated movement of over 3.6 million items



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
