#### EASTMAN DENTAL CLINIC

Adjoining the Royal Free Hupitel, Gray's Inv. Road, W.C. 1.

THE Clinic has been founded by Mr. George Eastman as a gift to London, with the primary object of benefiting the children resident in the vicinity of Gray's Inn Road, and to prove that greater care of the teeth in the case of adolescents confers general improvement of health during the later life of the individual.

Mr. George Eastman also intends that what is now about to be accomplished shall be an object lesson over a far wider area.

Public opinion has been stirred during the past few years to realise more attention must be given to the condition of children's teeth at the earliest age, and Dental Clinics are now in existence for providing certain treatment for children attending Elementary Schools. These Clinics are established in association with the Public Health Authorities.

In the Eastman Dental Clinic which is under construction and will be opened in 1930, a greater scope will be provided for treatment than in the clinics already established.

In addition to the treatment of children of all ages, provision will be made for the care of teeth of nursing mothers, and the woman who is about to become a mother. The maternity work of the Royal Free Hospital has already achieved a notable acknowledgement and the Ministry of Health through its principle Medical Officer, Sir George Newman, has recognised the need for dental treatment at all stages of maternity. Orthodontia, or the science of dental regulation, which hitherto has received limited attention, will be an important feature of the work to be affected in the Eastman Dental Clinic. This branch of dental work has been developed more widely in America amongst the wage country classes than in this country, and the results are now strikingly apparent.

It is anticipated that the institution of the Dental Clinic will evoke the interest of the entire dental profession and sympathetic support of the Public Authorities.

Accommodation will be reserved for reception of children requiring operative treatment for removal of tonsils and adenoids, for hare lip and plastic surgery.

The Clinic will be administered by a Board of which the Rt. Hon Lord Riddell is the President, and the professional work will be in the care of a Director, holding Medical and Dental qualifications, with whom will be associated department chiefs specially fitted for the responsible duties they will be called upon to perform in the service of the Clinic and for the benefit of the public.

A great advantage will be gained by the experience of the of the Rochester Dental Dispensary which was founded by Mr. George Eastman in 1915, and has proved a great success in the treatment of children many of whom are now experiencing the advantages of early treatment.

#### ORDER OF RECEPTION.

His ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCE OF WALES will arrive at the main entrance of the Royal Free Hospital and will be received by the Right Hon. Lord Riddell, President of the Hospital.

A procession will be formed and approach the platform erected on the site. On the arrival of His ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCE OF WALES, the Band of the Grenadier Guards will play the National Anthem.

An Address of welcome to His Royal Highness will be made by the Right Hon. Lord Riddell, who will ask His Royal Highness to lay the Foundation Stone.

Sir Albert Levy, with the permission of His Royal Highness, will place a casket in the Foundation Stone, containing the following articles:

> Copy of the authorised programme of the day. Copy of "The Times" of the day. Specimens of the Current Coins of the day. Current edition of the Hospital Report.

D. Roeside, Esq., (Sir J. Burnett & Partners) Architect, will offer the Prince of Wales a trowel with which His Royal Highness will spread the mortar, and the stone will then be lowered into place.

W. Elliot, Esq., (Messrs. Trollope & Colls) Contractor, will offer to the Prince of Wales the maul and lever and His Royal Highness will tap and level the stone and declare it to be well and truly laid.

The Right Hon. Stanley Baldwin, Prime Minister, will acknowledge the gift made by Mr. George Eastman.

Mr. Ray Atherton on behalf of the American Ambassador will respond.
