Using the Internet for Health Information

eHealth is short for electronic health. It is the use of technology for health, which can include phone apps, online medical records, and using the internet for health information. Are you eHealth literate? Can you easily find health information online? Can you determine which health web sites are credible? Can you understand and apply the health information you find? These are all eHealth literacy skills.

The four over-the-counter (OTC) pain relievers listed on the right have risks and benefits that should be weighed when selecting medicines. Your team will do internet research to determine which pain reliever is "best" for back pain. One member of each team will research one of the medications. Then, the teams will meet to discuss which medication the team thinks is best for back pain.
