- Participants will receive an overview of opioid use among Wisdom Keepers (Older Adults); reasons for abuse; the power of the use stigmatizing language, the reason that language matters; how loneliness and shame increase the use of opioids among Wisdom Keepers; and effective ways to reduce the stigma that Wisdom Keepers face which keep them from the support they need and deserve.

Biopsychosocial Approach to Pain in Older Adults

- This presentation will review the biopsychosocial model and how this approach is effective in addressing pain as well as the unique psychological and social comorbidities in an older population.

<u>The Opioid Epidemic – How we have gotten to this point, its' effects on older adults, and where do we go from here?</u>

- This session will review the three waves of the opioid epidemic: prescription opioids, heroin, and synthetic opioids putting into context the relative lack of knowledge concerning the needs of older adults throughout the crisis. We will examine the unique aspects of addiction and substance misuse for older adult patients/client and describe strategies to engage older adults and caregivers in reduction of harm and engagement in treatment programs.

Alternatives to Pain Medications

- Management of pain without medication provides patients with an effective option for relief of pain. The non-pharmacological therapies aim to treat the behavioral, affective, cognitive, and other non-somatic dimensions of the pain. The rationale behind using alternatives to pain medications will be presented in context of pain complexity. Several tools and methods used as alternatives to pain medications will be reviewed. Contributions of the non-pharmacological therapies to management of pain will be discussed in terms of holistic care of pain patients.

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
