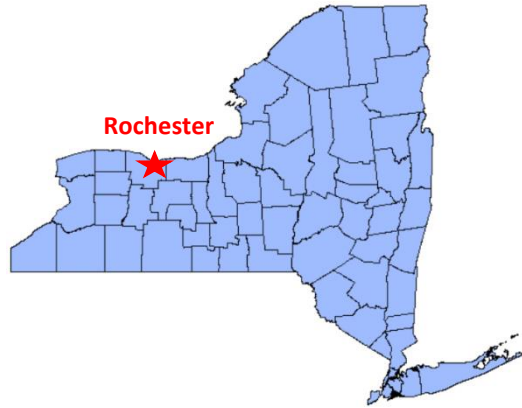

CONTINUING EDUCATION

Conference Goal

To promote the professional development of prehospital providers surrounding the delivery and stabilization of newborn infants in the field.

Target Audience

We invite prehospital providers from Emergency Medical Services (EMS) in New York State to participate.

Learning Objectives

- Outline signs, risk factors and available resources for an imminent delivery in the field.
- Demonstrate how to perform an uncomplicated vaginal delivery and the initial management of common delivery complications.
- Demonstrate the steps to stabilize a newborn in the field during the golden minute of life.
- Develop skills to train pre-hospital providers on newborn delivery and stabilization.

Continuing Education Credits

6.5 hours of continuing medical education credits are available to EMS providers and will be issued by the University of Rochester Division of Prehospital Medicine upon conference completion.

WORKSHOPS and DESCRIPTIONS

Breakout Sessions

Delivery of the Newborn

Participants will learn and demonstrate how to perform a routine vaginal delivery (vertex position) and a breech delivery. Workshop leaders will also review strategies to manage potential complications, including a prolapsed umbilical cord, breech presentation and shoulder dystocia.

Stabilization of the Newborn

Participants will learn and demonstrate how to stabilize an infant after birth, with focus on newborn assessment and intervention during the Golden Minute of life.

Special Considerations in the Prehospital Environment

Participants will discuss special considerations related to the infant (e.g., extreme prematurity) and environment (e.g., temperature, location of delivery, etc.). They will demonstrate interventions before, during and after the delivery to mitigate risk to the newborn.

Train-the-trainer Workshop

Participants will receive an educator's toolkit and learn how to facilitate case discussions using case or video vignettes. They will also learn how to facilitate simulated deliveries and team debriefings.
