A study conducted by CARE Resident Erin T. Kelly, MD found that letting children pick their own summer reading material helps their reading skills. This finding will be used by the Rochester City School District as another tool in its quest to get its younger students reading at grade level. Erin partnered with Professor Carol St. George from the University of Rochester's Warner School of Education and the Rochester City School District School #36. Funding for her project was provided by the Brighter Days Foundation, M & T Bank and The Hoekelman Center. Erin presented her research findings at the 2015 Pediatric Academic Societies Meeting in San Diego, California and her findings made national and local news.
