Voter registration deadlines:

Online or In person: registered by **Oct 9**

By mail: postmarked by **Oct 9**. Received by **Oct 14**

Voting Dates:

Early voting: Oct 24, 2020 - Nov 1, 2020

General election: Nov 3, 2020

Voting by absentee ballot deadlines:

Date	Deadline information
October 27	Last day to postmark an application or letter of application by mail for an absentee ballot.
November 2	Last day to apply IN-PERSON for absentee ballot.
November 3	Last day to postmark ballot . Must be received by the local board of elections no later than Nov. 10th. Military Voter Ballots must be received no later than Nov. 16th.
November 3	Last day to deliver ballot IN-PERSON to the local board of elections (by someone other than the voter).
