## Survey Results: Educational Needs Assessment on Equity & Inclusion for Managers and Supervisors with Reports

As part of our Pharmacy Department's strategic plan, we conducted a needs assessment survey to better understand the educational priorities of our managers and supervisors around diversity, equity, and inclusion (DEI). Our goal is to provide meaningful, relevant training to advance our DEI efforts. In addition to identifying key training topics, we assessed where we currently stand on our DEI journey. This will serve as a benchmark for comparing our progress year over year.

The top seven priorities identified from available trainings in MyPath were:

- 1. Health & Wellness: Combatting Stress & Anxiety
- 2. Team Building for Leaders
- 3. Mental Health Awareness
- 4. Managing a Multigenerational Team
- 5. Building Inclusive Leadership

#### 6. Change Management for Leaders

#### 7. Emotional Intelligence

More guidance will be shared with managers soon regarding specific training requirements for the upcoming year.

We will continue to assess our position on the DEI journey in the coming years to ensure we make meaningful progress. In line with the next steps of our strategic plan, our department is committed to expanding this initiative by providing training on healthcare disparities and social determinants of health for all learners (students, interns, residents, pharmacists, technicians, etc.) and preceptors. We also aim to promote the integration of these critical topics into our teaching practices by incorporating related elements into assessment rubrics for presentations.

#### Lifespan Gives Strong Outpatient Pharmacy a Shout-Out

This summer Lifespan Board of Directors recognized Mike Flannery, Cindy Apostolakos and the Strong Outpatient Pharmacy team for their work partnering to vaccinate hard to reach older adult residents of Monroe in 2023/24. Their collaboration brought clinics to over 25 locations to vaccinate 694 people aged 60 and over against COVID and flu!

#### American College of Clinical Pharmacy Diversity, Equity, Inclusion, and Accessibility Toolkit

#### The New England Journal of Medicine - Efforts Towards Equity

The New England Journal of Medicine published six perspective pieces discussing DEI related problems and how the authors' and their peers proposed solutions locally. Check out two highlights below:

A Multitiered Mentorship Model - Fostering Inclusive Pathways to Health Careers
 Reviews the lack of diversity in health-related fields and focuses on a small group of high school students to support their interest in STEM careers. A mentoring program named

STEM+M Connect was utilized to bring undergraduate mentors of various backgrounds to high school students to assist with career exploration. Preliminary results show that early opportunities for career exploration increases high school participants' interest in STEM and health-related fields, as well as confidence in their ability to succeed and belong, with 11 out of the 37 participating students enrolling in college for STEM or health -related fields.

• An Urban Farm-Anchored Produce Prescription Program - Food as Medicine and Economic Justice Explores the implementation of a produce prescription program called VeggieRx to a food insecure population in Chicago. The produce prescriptions were provided by clinicians to patients with diet-related disease also experiencing food insecurity. Patients had appointments with clinicians at an agricultural facility that was accessible by bus and train routes where they could receive weekly prescriptions for fresh produce, nutrition education classes, dietary counseling and cooking lessons. Classes were held in person and virtually in English and Spanish and were also posted online. In 2023, a total of 2,592 patients have participated with 31% reporting a decrease in food insecurity. The authors also found that their VeggieRx participants had significant reductions in weight and BMI when compared to control group from same health system.
