

PGY-1 Community-based Residency Program

Completion of Program Requirements

1. NYS Licensure – – Per Resident Licensure Policy
2. Required goals and objectives
 - a. At minimum, 80% of all objectives must be achieved for the residency per the current ASHP PGY1 Residency Accreditation Standards.
 - b. The remaining 20% that are not achieved for the residency, must all at the very least, be in satisfactory progress, with no needs improvement.
3. Successful completion of all required and scheduled learning experiences
 - a. All assignments and activities of the learning experience as required by the primary preceptor of the rotation must be completed
4. Professional development log within development plan
 - a. All required activities must be completed
5. Guideline Review/Topic Discussions/Patient Management -minimum 9
 - a. Asthma, COPD, Diabetes Mellitus, Heart Failure, Hyperlipidemia, Hypertention, Tobacco Use disorder, 2 elective topics
6. Major projects-minimum 2
 - a. Primary project
 - i. Platform style or poster presentation to an external audience
 - ii. written report (ex. manuscript and/or formal written report suitable for interested parties)
 - b. Secondary project
 - i. ex. MUE, Clinical program development/enhancement/analysis, pipeline forecast, cost or budget analysis, QI
 1. Develop a project plan
 2. develop and present a final report
7. Teaching Certificate
8. Presentations minimum 6
 - a. 1 - 1 hour CE accredited presentation
 - b. 1 - 30 min CE accredited presentation
 - c. Others will be assigned by rotation preceptors
9. Journal Clubs
 - a. 2 with ambulatory pharmacists as the audience
 - b. 1 for each required block rotation
10. Community service or advocacy work
11. Business Plan or Process Improvement Plan
12. Medication event reporting/improvement of medication use system
 - a. All assigned events must be closed
13. Pharmacademic
 - a. All assigned evaluations must be completed prior to the last day of the residency

Presentation and/or other requirements may be revised at the discretion of the program director and coordinator during the residency year without prior notice
