- CA 19-9 is now performed on a daily basis on our Roche Cobas e601 Immunoassay analyzers
- Turnaround times will improve
- The container type remains the same (SST), but there is a change to the reference range as follows:
- Current Range: <55 U/mL New Range: <36 U/mL

- Kappa and Lambda Free Light Chain assays are now performed on Monday-Friday dayshift basis
- Turnaround times will improve
- The container type remains the same (SST), and reference ranges remain the same as well
