The goal of this program is to distribute insecticide-treated bed nets in Africa. Insecticide treated bed nets are an evidence-based method for preventing malaria, which is one of the deadliest diseases in the world. Dr. Sherman founded the organization along with a classmate in medical school. As a CARE resident, he has been able to take his organization to the next level by appointing a board of directors and revamping the website.
